## Inclusive education

In 2018 we renewed our Inclusive education policy which commits us to continuing our journey towards a more inclusive education system, at all levels and as part of our everyday practice in schools, educational settings and classrooms. Our commitment means that children and young people from across Queensland, from all social, cultural community and family backgrounds, and of all identities and all abilities are able to:

- attend their local state school or education centre and be welcomed
- access and participate in high-quality education and fully engage in the curriculum along-side their similar-aged peers
- learn in a safe and supportive environment free from bullying, discrimination or harassment
- achieve academically and socially with reasonable adjustment and supports tailored to meet their learning needs.

State schools across Queensland are taking positive steps towards implementing the policy for all students at their school. ## **National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS)**
